## **South Carolina's Process for Reviewing NWPs**

- SCDHEC has two certification actions to take for the nationwide permits:
  - Certification pursuant to Section 401 of the Clean Water
     Act
  - Coastal Zone Consistency Certification in accordance with the Coastal Zone Management Act
- State law requires SCDHEC to coordinate these certifications.
- Once the final NWPs are published, the public notice will serve as an application to SCDHEC.

## South Carolina's Process for Reviewing NWPs

- SCDHEC will accept comments and issue a Notice of Department Decision.
- The Decision
   becomes effective in
   15 days unless a
   review (first step in
   the state appeal
   process) is requested.

### **South Carolina's NWP Conditions**

- In 2012, SCDHEC conditioned the following NWP:
  - NWP 12 Utility Line Activities
  - NWP 14 Linear Transportation Projects
  - NWP 23 Approved Categorical Exclusions
  - NWP 29 Residential Developments
  - NWP 39 Commercial and Institutional Developments
  - NWP 42 Recreational Facilities
  - NWP 43 Stormwater Management Facilities
  - NWP 44 Mining Activities
  - NWP 46 Discharges in Ditches
- Conditions to protect sensitive waters and reduce the scope of the impacts.

## **South Carolina's NWP Conditions**

- SCDHEC does not authorize
   NWPs in the Critical Area.
- Critical Area is defined as coastal waters, tidelands, beach/dune systems and beaches.
- In the Critical Area of the coast, SCDHEC must issue an individual Critical Area Permit for all NWPs. This doesn't apply to the 401 certification.

### **South Carolina's Current Process**

- Comments on proposed NWP by August 1<sup>st.</sup>
- Regional Conditions
  - Charleston District accepting comments on proposed Regional Conditions until July 22nd.
- SCDHEC will accept comments on the 401 and czc conditions.
- Issue a Notice of Dept.
   Decision within 45 days of publication of final NWPs.

### South Carolina's Lessons Learned

- Work with Corps
   District on Regional
   Conditions.
- 60 days is not a lot of time to review final NWPs, review comments and issue certification decision.
