Policy

- September 2022, DNREC produced a report, as directed, to evaluate options for a state freshwater wetland protection program.
- Following the Sackett vs EPA wetland case the Delaware Legislature passed Senate
 Concurrent Resolution 86 (SCR86) directing DNREC to re-evaluate federal wetland
 protection coverage in Delaware.
- DNREC used GIS to map and estimate how freshwater wetland protection would change in Delaware.
- The geospatial analysis results show that roughly 75,000 acres of nontidal wetlands are vulnerable, representing about 45% of Delaware's nontidal wetlands.
