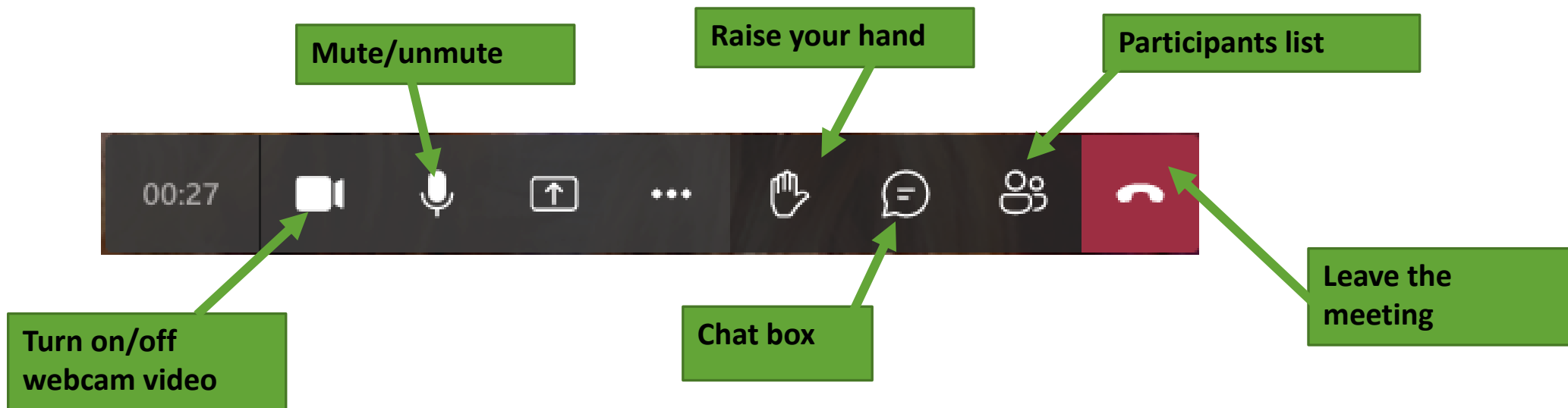

Raise your hand: To ask a question.



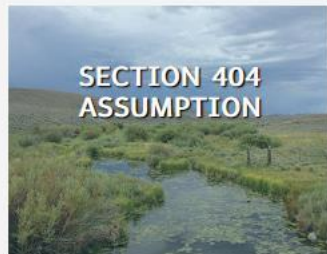
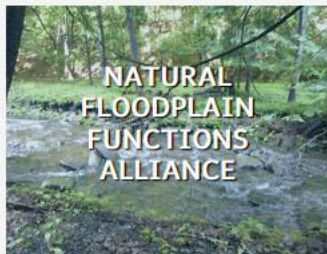
