COMPETITIVE GRANTS: TIPS AND TRIPS TO A SUCCESSFUL APPLICATION



FIRST, A BASIC TRUTH:

- UNDERSTAND THAT FEDERAL GRANT FUNDING CAN BE VERY COMPETITIVE. THE NUMBER OF REQUESTS FOR FUNDING IS ALWAYS GREATER THAN THE FUNDS AVAILABLE.
- DON'T BE DISCOURAGED IF YOU ARE NOT APPROVED FOR FUNDING. ASK QUESTIONS IF YOUR PROPOSAL IS NOT ACCEPTED. LEARN WITH THE EXPERIENCE AND REMEMBER THAT YOU WILL BE ABLE TO APPLY ON THE NEXT ROUND AND HOPEFULLY, EVENTUALLY, BE ABLE TO SECURE FUNDING FOR YOUR PROJECT!

COMPETITIVE GRANTS IN GENERAL: HELPFUL HINTS

 THE NUMBER ONE REASON WHY GRANT APPLICATIONS ARE DENIED IS FAILURE TO FOLLOW DIRECTIONS.

COMPETITIVE GRANTS IN GENERAL: HELPFUL HINTS

- THERE ARE DEADLINES FOR SUBMITTING QUESTIONS VIA E-MAIL OR BY PHONE THAT ARE IDENTIFIED IN THE RFA;
 - READ THE GRANT APPLICATION GUIDELINES TO MAKE SURE YOU CAN STILL MAKE THE CALL OR E-MAIL THE CONTACT WITHIN THAT DEADLINE.
- CALL THE FUNDING SOURCE CONTACT FOR ASSISTANCE IF YOU HAVE QUESTIONS ABOUT ANY PORTION OF THE APPLICATION.
 - ASKING A FUNDER FOR HELP WON'T HURT YOUR CHANCES OF GETTING A GRANT. IN FACT, DOING SO MAY EVEN HELP BECAUSE YOU'RE FILLING OUT FORMS IN THE BEST POSSIBLE WAY.
- IF THE TIME WINDOW HAS PASSED TO ASK QUESTIONS, LOOK AT THE AGENCY'S WEBSITE FOR A LINK TO FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQS). OTHERS HAVE PROBABLY ASKED THE SAME QUESTIONS YOU HAVE, AND THE AGENCY MAY HAVE POSTED THE ANSWER FOR THE GENERAL PUBLIC.



COMPETITIVE GRANTS:

- READ REQUEST FOR APPLICATION (RFA)
 CAREFULLY
 - THEY DO CHANGE SO BE SURE YOU READ THE CURRENT ONE (E.G., EPA REGIONAL PRIORITIES MAY IDENTIFY SPECIFIC ITEMS TO ADDRESS & MAY CHANGE IN CONSECUTIVE GRANT CYCLES)
- PAST RFAS CAN ASSIST YOU IN PREPARING AND GATHERING INFORMATION, BUT REMEMBER YOU ARE RESPONDING TO THE CURRENT RFA AND YOUR APPLICATION MUST MATCH THE CRITERIA OF THE CURRENT RFA



THE WETLAND PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT (GRANT (WPDG) RFA: WHAT DOES EPA WANT IN THE APPLICATION?

- SECTION I: FUNDING OPPORTUNITY ANNOUNCEMENT (FOA) DESCRIPTION/REQUEST FOR APPLICATION (RFA)
 - INCLUDES A COMPLETE DESCRIPTION OF THE PROGRAM OR PROJECT ACTIVITIES AND AREA OF INTEREST; DESCRIBES THE FUNDING OPPORTUNITY; AND PROVIDES THE STATUTORY AUTHORITY AND GOVERNING PROGRAM REGULATIONS, IF ANY.
- SECTION II: AWARD INFORMATION
 - INCLUDES THE ANTICIPATED FUNDING AMOUNT AND NUMBER OF AWARDS; LENGTH OF THE PROJECT PERIODS; AND, FOR COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS, A DESCRIPTION OF THE AGENCY'S ANTICIPATED SUBSTANTIAL INVOLVEMENT IN THE FUNDED PROJECT.
- SECTION III: ELIGIBILITY INFORMATION
 - DESCRIBES WHAT TYPES OF ENTITIES ARE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY, ANY COST-SHARING REQUIREMENTS, AND RESPONSIVENESS OR SCREENING CRITERIA.

THE APPLICATION?

- SECTION IV: APPLICATION AND SUBMISSION INFORMATION
 - OUTLINES ALL APPLICATION AND SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS. THIS INCLUDES REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND BUDGET; GUIDANCE ON FORMATTING/#OF PAGES; APPLICATION SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS; REQUIRED FORMS; ASSURANCES AND CERTIFICATIONS; FUNDING RESTRICTIONS; AND OTHER SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS, SUCH AS LETTERS OF INTENT, IF APPLICABLE.

THIS SECTION IS VERY IMPORTANT!!



THE WPDG RFA: CONTINUED

- SECTION V: APPLICATION REVIEW INFORMATION
 - LISTS CRITERIA THAT REVIEWERS WILL USE TO EVALUATE AND SCORE APPLICATIONS, INFORMATION ON THE REVIEW AND AWARD SELECTION PROCESS, AND ANTICIPATED ANNOUNCEMENT AND AWARD DATES.
- SECTION VI: AWARD ADMINISTRATION INFORMATION
 - PROVIDES INFORMATION ON AWARD NOTICES, ADMINISTRATIVE AND NATIONAL POLICY REQUIREMENTS, AND POST-AWARD REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.
- SECTION VII: AGENCY CONTACTS
 - PROVIDES A PROGRAM OFFICE CONTACT AND A GRANTS MANAGEMENT CONTACT.
- SECTION VIII: OTHER INFORMATION
 - INCLUDES ADDITIONAL INFORMATION SUCH AS HELPFUL WEBSITES AND AN APPLICATION CHECKLIST.
- ATTACHMENTS- LOOK AT WHAT IS ALLOWED AND WHAT ISN'T AS AN ATTACHMENT TO AN APPLICATION.
 - BE SURE THAT THE APPLICATION NARRATIVE DOES NOT EXCEED THE PAGE #'S ALLOWED AND THAT ATTACHMENTS MAY BE IN ADDITION TO THAT PAGE #



REVIEW THE RFA: KEY THINGS TO NOTE

- IDENTIFY ANY DEADLINES FOR APPLICATION SUBMISSION AND THE PROCESS FOR APPLICATION SUBMISSIONS.
- NOTE ANY PAGE RESTRICTIONS FOR APPLICATIONS.
- IDENTIFY ALLOWABLE AND NON-ALLOWABLE ACTIVITIES THAT CAN BE COVERED BY FEDERAL FUNDS (E.G., WPDGS CAN FUND DEVELOPMENT AND PLANNING ACTIVITIES, DEMONSTRATIONS, PILOT STUDIES, BUT NOT ONGOING IMPLEMENTATION OF WETLAND PROGRAMS).
- LOOK AT THE SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS (BUILD IN TIME FOR THE SUBMISSION TO GRANTS.GOV & YOUR MANAGEMENT APPROVALS, NOT JUST DEVELOPING THE APPLICATION).
- MAKE SURE THAT YOUR DESIGNATED PERSON W/ A GRANTS.GOV ACCOUNT WILL BE AVAILABLE TO SUBMIT THE APPLICATION ON TIME.
- LOOK AT THE SCORING CRITERIA. NOTE THE CRITERIA THAT AFFECT SCORING THE MOST, TO HELP GUIDE YOUR PROPOSAL DEVELOPMENT.12



DECIDING TO APPLY?

WRITING A GRANT APPLICATION IS A FORMIDABLE TASK THAT CAN TAKE MANY HOURS. BEFORE YOU BEGIN, BE SURE YOU CAN ANSWER "YES" TO THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS:

- HAVE I READ THE RFA COMPLETELY AND CAREFULLY? DO I UNDERSTAND IT?
- IS MY ORGANIZATION ELIGIBLE TO APPLY, BASED ON THE ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA DESCRIBED IN THE RFA?
- DOES MY ORGANIZATION HAVE THE TECHNICAL EXPERTISE, PERSONNEL, AND FINANCIAL CAPACITY TO SUCCESSFULLY IMPLEMENT THE PROJECT GOALS AND EXPECTATIONS? DOES MY ORGANIZATION'S MISSION ALIGN WITH THE GOALS PRESENTED IN THE RFA?
- DO STAKEHOLDERS AND LEADERS IN MY ORGANIZATION SUPPORT APPLYING FOR THIS GRANT?
- IS MY ORGANIZATION PREPARED TO DO WHAT IT TAKES TO SUCCESSFULLY IMPLEMENT THE PROJECT WITHIN THE BUDGET AND TIMELINE WE PROPOSE?
 - CONSIDER THE ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS THAT COME WITH FEDERAL FUNDING, SUCH AS ANY MATCH REQUIREMENTS, QUALITY ASSURANCE PROJECT PLANS, REQUIRED REPORTING, AUDITING AND FISCAL MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITIES, SHARING GRANT PRODUCTS AND PROVIDING OUTREACH AND TECH TRANSFER, ETC.



WPDG APPLICATIONS ARE SCORED BY **ASSIGNING A** MAXIMUM OF 100 **POINTS ACROSS** SPECIFIC CRITERIA THIS IS SIMILAR TO MANY COMPETITIVE **GRANT RFAS**

- §PROJECT NEED (15 POINTS)
- §PROJECT TASKS -INCLUDING METHODS AND APPROACHES (20 POINTS)
- §MILESTONE SCHEDULE (10 POINTS)
- §BUDGET NARRATIVE AND SF424A (5 POINTS)
- §TRANSFER OF RESULTS (10 POINTS)
- §ENVIRONMENTAL RESULTS (15 POINTS) (OUTPUTS/OUTCOMES/TRACKING)
- §PROGRAMMATIC CAPABILITY/TECHNICAL EXPERIENCE/QUALIFICATIONS (7 POINTS)
- §PARTNERSHIPS (10 POINTS)
- §PAST PERFORMANCE (8 POINTS)

NOTE: FOR REGIONAL WPDG RFAS THERE MAY BE REGIONAL PRIORITY POINTS IDENTIFIED (ENV. JUSTICE, CLIMATE CHANGE, SALMON HABITAT RECOVERY)



WRITING A STRONG PROPOSAL

- THE PROJECT NARRATIVE IS ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT PARTS OF YOUR GRANT APPLICATION. IT'S YOUR OPPORTUNITY TO TELL THE GRANTOR AND REVIEWERS YOUR STORY.
- BE SURE YOUR SPECIFIC PROJECT GOALS AND OBJECTIVES ARE CLEARLY DEFINED:
 - PROVIDE STRONG AND CLEAR PROJECT NEED DESCRIPTION
 - USE YOUR DATA AND WORDS TO PAINT A PICTURE OF HOW YOUR PROGRAM AND YOUR COMMUNITY COULD BENEFIT FROM THE OUTCOMES OF THIS PROJECT
 - PROVIDE EXPLICIT DESCRIPTION OF YOUR PROPOSED METHODS AND/OR APPROACHES TO ACHIEVE YOUR PROJECT TASKS, OUTCOMES AND OUTPUTS
 - HOW WILL YOU PRODUCE YOUR OUTCOMES/DELIVERABLES?
 - HOW DOES YOUR PROJECT FIT IN WITH YOUR EXISTING PROGRAM, TIE IN TO YOUR WPP IF YOU HAVE ONE, ETC.? IS THIS GRANT FOR DEVELOPMENT OF A WPP?
 - DESCRIBE THE ENVIRONMENTAL RESULTS (OUTPUTS/OUTCOMES)
 - BE SURE TO DESCRIBE HOW THE PROJECT BUILDS YOUR PROGRAM TO IMPROVE OR PROTECT WETLANDS AND AQUATIC RESOURCES ON YOUR LANDSCAPE IN ACREAGE AND FUNCTIONS
 - INCLUDE A PROJECT TIMELINE SHOWN IN A **MILESTONE SCHEDULE** WITH SPECIFIC TASKS AND SUB-TASKS AND WHAT THE START AND END DATES OF THOSE TASKS/SUB-TASKS ARE (TABLE FORMAT IS GREAT!)



WRITING A STRONG PROPOSAL

- ADDRESS HOW YOUR PROJECT MILESTONES WILL BE TRACKED (E.G., INTERNAL REPORTING AND REPORTING TO EPA)
 - PROVIDE A **DETAILED BUDGET** THAT EXPLAINS ALL PROJECT COSTS THAT ALIGNS
 TO THE PROPOSED TASKS
 - A DETAILED BUDGET NARRATIVE MUST JUSTIFY THE COSTS AND PROVIDE CLEAR BREAKDOWNS BY COST CATEGORY.
 - THIS DETAILED NARRATIVE BUDGET MUST ALSO MATCH YOUR 424A FORM
 - BE SURE TO ADDRESS BREAKDOWN FOR MATCH COSTS IF MATCH FUNDS ARE REQUIRED
 - DESCRIBE THE KNOWLEDGE, STAFFING, AND FISCAL CAPACITY THAT YOUR ORGANIZATION HAS TO CARRY OUT THE PROPOSED PROJECT AND MEET THE GOALS OF THE GRANT. BIOS AND CVS SHOULD BE ATTACHMENTS
- IDENTIFY PARTNERSHIPS: INCLUDING INTERNAL OR CROSS TRIBAL PROGRAM DEPARTMENTS AND ANY EXTERNAL AGENCIES OR OTHER PARTNERS. IF YOU DON'T HAVE EXTERNAL PARTNERS BE CLEAR ABOUT THE CROSS-PROGRAMMATIC AND/OR TRIBAL COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS; AND
- BE SURE TO PROVIDE DESCRIPTION OF **PAST PERFORMANCE** (ESP. FOR PAST WPDGS AND ANY OTHER EPA GRANTS; IF DON'T HAVE PAST WPDG, DESCRIBE OTHER PAST GRANTS 106, 319, GAP, OR OTHER AGENCY GRANTS)





CRITERIA TIP

- REVIEW THE CONTENT AND BE SURE YOU HAVE ADDRESSED ALL THE CRITERIA THAT WILL BE USED TO SCORE YOUR APPLICATION
 - IT IS IMPORTANT TO ADDRESS EVERY CRITERIA IN THE RFA TO THE BEST OF YOUR ABILITY.
- 5 OR 10 POINTS MAY NOT SEEM LIKE ALOT BUT IT CAN COST YOU, ESPECIALLY IF YOU LOOSE POINTS ON SEVERAL CRITERIA
- IF YOU DO NOT PROVIDE A RESPONSE FOR EVERY CRITERIA YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE THOSE POINTS, PERIOD
- THESE ARE COMPETITIVE GRANTS. IGNORING OR FAILING TO
 ADEQUATELY RESPOND TO CRITERIA WILL LEAVE THE APPLICATION
 AT A DISADVANTAGE





BUDGET

- HTTPS://WWW.EPA.GOV/GRANTS/HOW-DEVELOP-BUDGET
- A DETAILED BUDGET THAT INCLUDES THE ESTIMATED FUNDING AMOUNTS FOR EACH PROJECT TASK IS REQUIRED. EPA PROVIDES AN EXAMPLE DETAILED BUDGET IN THE REA.
- PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED COST FOR EACH OF THE BUDGET CATEGORIES FOUND IN FORM SF 424A (I.E., PERSONNEL, TRAVEL, CONTRACTUAL, OTHER, ETC). IDENTIFY FUNDING BY BUDGET CATEGORY FOR EACH YEAR OF FUNDING REQUEST.
- EXPLAIN IF AND HOW NON-FEDERAL PARTNERS WILL CONTRIBUTE TO THE REQUIRED COST SHARE/MATCH.
- THIS IS AN OPPORTUNITY TO PROVIDE A NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF THE BUDGET, INCLUDING OTHER COSTS AND CONTRACTS.
- DESCRIBE ITEMIZED COSTS IN SUFFICIENT DETAIL FOR THE EPA TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE COSTS FOR EACH COMPONENT/TASK ARE REASONABLE AND ALLOWABLE, INCLUDING THE USE OF THE COST SHARE/MATCH FUNDS.

O THE PROBLEMS WE OFTEN SEE (TRIPS OR COMMON MISTAKES)

- RECYCLING AN OLDER GRANT APPLICATION
 WITHOUT UPDATING IT TO REFLECT NEW RFA
 REQUIREMENTS.
- FORGETTING TO ADDRESS THE REQUIRED 25% MATCH* (EITHER IN THE BUDGET OR THE NARRATIVE).
- EXPLAIN IF YOU PLAN ON INCLUDING A
 WETLAND GRANT IN YOUR PPG; YOUR MATCH
 REQUIREMENT MAY BE SUBSTANTIALLY LESS
- ADDING TOO MUCH EXTRA
 INFORMATION NOT REQUESTED IN THE RFA
- INCLUDING INELIGIBLE COSTS (PAYING FOR CONSTRUCTION, PURCHASE OF VEHICLES, ONGOING IMPLEMENTATION, ETC).



OFTEN SEE (TRIPS OR COMMON MISTAKES)

- EXCEEDING THE PAGE LIMIT (YES, THAT REQUIREMENT IS REAL)!
- PROBLEMS WE · NOT PROVIDING CLEAR INFORMATION ON BUDGET EXPENSES BY EACH COST CATEGORY
 - YOUR NARRATIVE BUDGET DOES NOT MATCH YOUR 424 AND 424A
 - FAILING TO ADDRESS EVERY CRITERIA, COMPLETELY AND CLEARLY
 - MISSING THE APPLICATION SUBMISSION DUE DATE
 - INCOMPLETE APPLICATION (MISSING FORMS, ETC).
 - MISSING ATTACHMENTS





O THE PROBLEMS WE OFTEN SEE (TRIPS OR COMMON MISTAKES)

- FAILING TO SUBMIT THE GRANT PROPERLY IN GRANTS.GOV
- IF YOU CAN'T UTILIZE GRANTS.GOV FOR A VALID REASON - CONTACT THE AGENCY POC AS SOON AS POSSIBLE
- NOT GETTING APPROVAL FROM TRIBAL COUNCIL BEFORE SUBMITTING APPLICATION (RECEIVING AN AWARD MAY REQUIRE COMMITMENT OF FISCAL RESOURCES -AKA. MATCH, ADDITIONAL EMPLOYEES, ETC).





O THE PROBLEMS WE OFTEN SEE (TRIPS OR COMMON MISTAKES)

- BEFORE YOU TURN IN YOUR
 APPLICATION, CONSIDER HAVING A
 FEW OTHER PEOPLE REVIEW IT. IT
 IS SURPRISING HOW EASILY WE CAN

ESTP Program Integration: Cross-Program Funding Opportunities for CE Actions

There are several funding types that States and Tribes can use to help them complete the Actions listed in the ESTP Core Element Framework (CEF). We identified at least 9 funding and/or resource types that the States and Tribes can use to help them accomplish or make progress on their WPPs: Wetland Program Development Grant (WPDG), CWA 106, CWA 319, General Assistance Program (GAP), State Revolving Fund (SRF), the Healthy Watershed Consortium Grant (HWCG), 5 STAR/Urban Waters Restoration Grant Program, and the Environmental Finance Center (EFC) (EFC will be described in a separate paragraph at the bottom of Table 1).

Some of these funding programs are more traditional and have been used for wetland work for quite a while, and others may be a program that you never thought or heard of for wetland projects. In this document, we developed 3 primary tables that describes each funding program to assist a State or Tribe with their funding search endeavors for wetland projects and for completing their ESTP CE Actions. We have also corresponded each ESTP Action (color coded to match the Region 7 Tiering Chart) with the appropriate funding type.
